At the CRC in Scranton in August, there were 7 of the 12 chapters represented at the historian's workshop. Six chapters had historical displays – Baltimore, Central PA, Hampton Roads, National Capital, Richmond and Roanoke. For those who did not attend, I can email you the power point presentation if you are interested.

Now is the time to set your goals and determine how to reach 200 points for par in historical PAOE for the year. Plan a historical program for a meeting. Plan a leadership recall for a past president in your chapter to add to your chapter history. Ensure your chapter history is up to date, is properly indexed and is digitized. If you don't have a plan, it won't happen. Be sure to enter your PAOE points on the society webpage as you earn them.

To get a copy of the PAOE historical criteria, go to the ASHRAE website and download a copy. Use the shortcut and select PAOE. The point requirements are in Ron Jarnigan's newsletter located on the PAOE page. You can also download a copy of the Historian's Guide if you don't have one. Under the tab Membership, select Committees. Scroll down and select the Historical Committee to find the guide. There is a lot of useful information in this guide.

I would also encourage all chapter historians to seriously consider participating in the Gold Ribbon Award program this year. A three year update for the history of the chapter will satisfy the requirement for the award. The history of a person, a system or a company are also eligible for consideration and could also qualify you for society's Lou Flagg Historical Award.

The hottest topic that came out of RP training this year was **Endowing ASHRAE Research through ASHRAE Foundation**. This is a great way for you to support research into perpetuity. Here is the basic information:

Minimum of \$2,500 to start new restricted research fund

Can be added to every year, at any amount

Full amount counts toward your RP Goal

5% interest earned and invested, in your name every year starting with Year 2 ... forever

This is a great way to honor past presidents of chapters or members who have contributed a lot towards a chapter.

Region III has always been very successful when it comes to the RP campaign and it is largely due to the efforts of everyone within the chapters.

Again, thank you for your continued commitment to ASHRAE!

Distinguished Lecturers

Region III has five DL allocations remaining. If these allocations are not used by November 30th, they will be forfeited and other regions will have a first come first serve chance at using them. I am very pleased with the coordination that is being done between chapters when scheduling DL's for multi-chapter visits. Many non-allocated visits have been scheduled by Region III chapters and I applaud that as well.

Technology Awards

It is not too early to set an entry deadline for your chapter's technology award competition. The Region III entry deadline is May 15. Set your chapter deadline to provide ample time for judging and post judging revision to meet the Region deadline. After participating in the judging panel for the society awards, I have a few pointers for entries wishing to continue to the society level competition:

- Clearly state why the designer/team believes the project was innovative.
- Double check the entry to make sure the requirements have been followed. (specifically, make sure text is double spaced and limited to 10 pages)
- Remove all commercialism
- If the actual energy consumption is significantly different than calculated, please comment on the difference.
